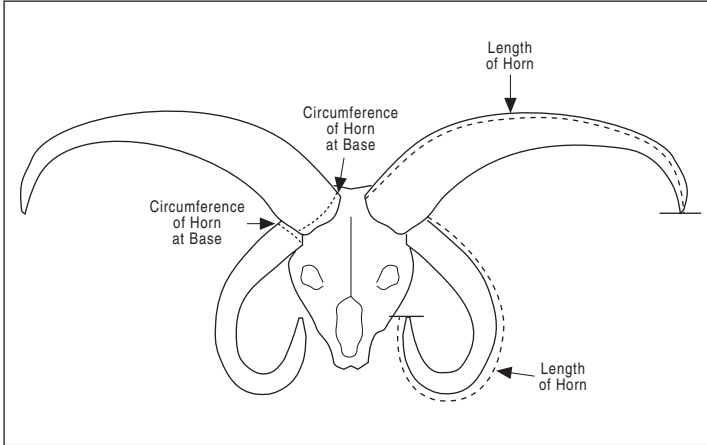

- 3) Please clearly label back of photo with name of hunter, name and score of animal, and date taken.
  - For simple horns and unbranched antlers: include 1 photo
  - For animals with branched antlers: include enough photos so that all tines can be clearly seen.
